PERFORMING ARTS CAMP

At Passaic Valley we make the most of our summer months. We hold The Passaic Valley Summer Performing Arts Camp (PVSPA), a 4 week summer camp funded by the Passaic Valley Education Foundation. The PVSPA camp is a great way for future Hornets to expand their knowledge and interest in the fine and performing arts courses offered at PV. The class options

Include: Concert Band, Guitar Class, Piano Class, Woodwinds, Brass, Voice Class, Acting and StageCraft, Musical Theatre, Dance Technique and Movement, Creative Writing, Painting and Drawing, Sculpture, Crafts, Cartooning, Make-Up and Fashion Design. Students also gain social skills that build character while connecting with new peers. For over ten years, Mr. Deluccia has organized and ran this program, and it continues to be a great success!



Our Summer Sports Camp Program is hosted by the PV Athletic Department, Head Coaches and their assistant staff. We are building positive momentum as we continue to see a large influx of transfer students and an increase in enrollment for the freshmen class. We are officially 1:1 with Chromebooks and our academic programs prepare students for the most prestigious universities. We have graduates attending Harvard, Cornell, Brown, Johns Hopkins, Georgetown, Fordham, RPI, Stevens Institute of Technology, George Washington, NYU, and Vassar.
