

The football team delivered a resounding 35-14 win: our cheerleaders and the squads from our three towns' elementary schools supported with enthusiasm on the sidelines, and the marching band debuted their new uniforms as they set the tone leading the fan zone throughout!

Ms. Pantale, Speech Language Pathologist



The Freshmen Football team went UNDEFEATED with a perfect score of 8-0, only allowing 1 touchdown against them all season!

Marching Band hosted their first "Live at the Hive" competition on the new turf on September 17, 2022. The PVHS Marching Band finished in 3rd place.

Gymnastics had an excellent season, improving their scores all season long. The team finished with an average team score of 85. They earned a 3rd place finish at the Passaic County Championships.

Girls Volleyball qualified for the NJSIAA Group 2 North 2 playoffs for the second consecutive season.

Cross Country The Boys' team finished in 8th place at the NJSIAA Sectional Meet. The Girls' team finished in 10th at the NJSIAA Sectional Meet. Senior Katharine Cottone, finished in 3rd place at the Group 2 North Sectional Meet and qualified for the 2nd year in a row for the Group 2 Championships. 
