#### RUBE GOLDBERG

The AP Physics classes are closing out the school year with their annual Rube Goldberg projects. The groups displayed their intricate designs to crowds of students and staff in the Physics Room on June 12th and 13th.

The Rube Goldberg projects are a 15 year tradition passed down from Ms. Shtraks, now led by Mr. Haimowitz and Mrs. Feo (who is on maternity leave and was missed very much this year.) The 2023 Team captains were Michael Preziosi and Beck Youngberg with the theme of Super Mario Brothers, and Connor O'Brien and Amanda Rausch with the theme of Minecraft. The craftsmanship and artistry included in the machine designs this year were exquisite! We are so proud of all of these students.

Rube Goldberg projects were named after the political cartoonist of the same name. Goldberg drew satirical cartoons depicting complicated chain reactions that achieved a simple goal as a way to comment on the politics of his time. When he eventually turned these devices into sculptures, it inspired a wave of sculptors and engineers to follow suit, leading to what are now known as "Rube Goldberg Machines."

Sophia Guarente was named 1st Team All County, 1st Team All League, and 1st Team All North Jersey. She was also nominated by North Jersey Sports Varsity Aces as a finalist as North Jersey Softball Player of the Year.
